## The Collect

your service, that we and all creation may be  
brought to the glorious liberty of  
the children of God;  
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord,  
who is alive and reigns with you,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit,  
one God, now and for ever. Amen

## Readings at 6.30pm

### First Reading: Isaiah 66. 10-14

<sup>10</sup> Rejoice with Jerusalem, and be glad for her,  
all you who love her;  
rejoice with her in joy,  
all you who mourn over her—  
<sup>11</sup> that you may nurse and be satisfied  
from her consoling breast;  
that you may drink deeply with delight  
from her glorious bosom.  
<sup>12</sup> For thus says the Lord:  
I will extend prosperity to her like a river,  
and the wealth of the nations like an  
overflowing stream;  
and you shall nurse and be carried on her arm,  
and dandled on her knees.  
<sup>13</sup> As a mother comforts her child,  
so I will comfort you;  
you shall be comforted in Jerusalem.  
<sup>14</sup> You shall see, and your heart shall rejoice;  
your bodies shall flourish like the grass;  
and it shall be known that the hand of the Lord is  
with his servants,  
and his indignation is against his enemies.

### Second Reading: Galatians 6. 7-16

<sup>7</sup> Do not be deceived; God is not mocked, for  
you reap whatever you sow. <sup>8</sup> If you sow to your  
own flesh, you will reap corruption from the  
flesh; but if you sow to the Spirit, you will reap  
eternal life from the Spirit. <sup>9</sup> So let us not grow  
weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at  
harvest time, if we do not give up. <sup>10</sup> So then,  
whenever we have an opportunity, let us work  
for the good of all, and especially for those of  
the family of faith. <sup>11</sup> See what large letters I  
make when I am writing in my own hand! <sup>12</sup> It is  
those who want to make a good showing in the  
flesh that try to compel you to be circumcised—  
only that they may not be persecuted for the  
cross of Christ. <sup>13</sup> Even the circumcised do not  
themselves obey the law,

but they want you to be circumcised so that they  
may boast about your flesh. <sup>14</sup> May I never boast  
of anything except the cross of our Lord Jesus  
Christ, by which the world has been crucified to  
me, and I to the world. <sup>15</sup> For neither  
circumcision nor uncircumcision is anything; but  
a new creation is everything! <sup>16</sup> As for those who  
will follow this rule—peace be upon them, and  
mercy, and upon the Israel of God.

### Gospel Reading: Luke 10. 1-11, 16-20

<sup>10</sup> After this the Lord appointed seventy others  
and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every  
town and place where he himself intended to go.  
<sup>2</sup> He said to them, 'The harvest is plentiful, but  
the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of  
the harvest to send out labourers into his  
harvest. <sup>3</sup> Go on your way. See, I am sending  
you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. <sup>4</sup>  
Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet  
no one on the road. <sup>5</sup> Whatever house you enter,  
first say, "Peace to this house!" <sup>6</sup> And if anyone  
is there who shares in peace, your peace will  
rest on that person; but if not, it will return to  
you. <sup>7</sup> Remain in the same house, eating and  
drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer  
deserves to be paid. Do not move about from  
house to house. <sup>8</sup> Whenever you enter a town  
and its people welcome you, eat what is set  
before you; <sup>9</sup> cure the sick who are there, and  
say to them, "The kingdom of God has come  
near to you." <sup>10</sup> But whenever you enter a town  
and they do not welcome you, go out into its  
streets and say, <sup>11</sup> "Even the dust of your town  
that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest  
against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God  
has come near."  
<sup>16</sup> 'Whoever listens to you listens to me, and  
whoever rejects you rejects me, and whoever  
rejects me rejects the one who sent me.'  
<sup>17</sup> The seventy returned with joy, saying, 'Lord,  
in your name even the demons submit to us!' <sup>18</sup>  
He said to them, 'I watched Satan fall from  
heaven like a flash of lightning. <sup>19</sup> See, I have  
given you authority to tread on snakes and  
scorpions, and over all the power of the enemy;  
and nothing will hurt you. <sup>20</sup> Nevertheless, do not  
rejoice at this, that the spirits submit to you, but  
rejoice that your names are written in heaven.'
