The Easter Liturgy

From earliest times Christians have gathered through the night of Easter to recall the story of God's saving work, from creation through to the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. However, the Easter Liturgy is not merely a presentation of God's work. It is meant to be a real experience of new life for the worshipper, a passing from darkness to light which offers hope to all the faithful. It is therefore important that the preparation is prayerful and thorough. The Easter Vigil marks the end of the emptiness of Holy Saturday, and leads into the celebration of Christ's resurrection. The singing of the Exsultet, the ancient hymn of triumph and rejoicing, links this night of our Christian redemption to the Passover night of Israel's redemption out of Egypt. Christian baptism is a participation in the death and resurrection of Christ, a dying to sin in order to be reborn in him, and the Easter Vigil was from early Christian times a preferred occasion for baptism. It is fittingly a time when those who are already Christians may repeat with renewed commitment the promises of their own baptism, and strengthen their sense of incorporation into the royal and priestly ministry of the whole people of God. The Easter Gospel is proclaimed with all the joy and splendour that the church can find.

The Vigil

Priest

Brothers and sisters in Christ, on this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus passed over from death to life, the Church invites her members, dispersed throughout the world, to gather in vigil and prayer. For this is the Passover of the Lord, in which through word and sacrament we share in his victory over death.

As we await the risen Christ, let us hear the record of God's saving deeds in history, recalling how he saved his people in ages past and in the fullness of time sent his son to be our redeemer; and let us pray that through this Easter celebration God may bring to perfection in each of us the saving work he has begun.

Priest

Eternal God, who made this most holy night to shine with the brightness of your one true light: set us aflame with the fire of your love, and bring us to the radiance of your heavenly glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

Christ yesterday and today, the beginning and the end, Alpha and Omega, all time belongs to him, and all ages; to him be glory and power, through every age and forever.

All Amen.

By his holy and glorious wounds may Christ our Lord guard and keep us.

The president lights the Paschal candle and says

May the light of Christ, rising in glory, Banish all darkness from our hearts and minds.

The Gospel

After the Gospel the congregation move to the unlit church. When all have entered, the minister bears the Paschal candle into the church, pausing at the back. The candle is raised and the minister says:

The minister moves a short way up the nave. The words are repeated:

The minister moves up to the chancel step.

The candle is placed in its stand in the chancel and the candles of the congregation are lit. The president says:

Priest Alleluia! Christ is risen.

All He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

The Exultet

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing choirs of angels! Exult, all creation around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen!

Sound the trumpet of salvation! Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendour, radiant in the brightness of your King!

Christ has conquered! Glory fill you! Darkness vanishes for ever! Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory!

The risen Saviour shines upon you! Let this place resound with joy, Echoing the mighty song of all God's people!

Priest Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **All** It is right to give thanks and praise.

Priest It is indeed right that with full hearts and minds and

voices we should praise you, the unseen God, the Father Almighty, and your only Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who has ransomed us by his death, and paid

for us the price of Adam's sin. For this is the

Passover of that true Lamb of God, by whose blood

the homes of all the faithful are hallowed and

protected.

This is the night when of old you saved our fathers, delivering the people of Israel from their slavery, and leading them dry shod through the sea.

This is the night when Jesus Christ vanquished hell and rose triumphant from the grave.

This is the night when all who believe in him are freed from sin and restored to grace and holiness.

Most blessed of all nights, when wickedness is put to flight and sin is washed away, lost innocence regained, and mourning turned to joy.

Therefore, heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, accept our sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering; and grant this Easter candle make our darkness light; for Christ the morning star has risen, never again to set, and is alive and reigns for ever and ever.

Sermon

The Initiation

A large shell is filled with Holy Water on the Altar.

Priest

As we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead, we remember that through the paschal mystery we have died and been buried with him in baptism, so that we may rise with him to a new life within the family of his church. Now that we have completed our observance of Lent, we renew the promises made at our baptism, affirming our allegiance to Christ, and our rejection of all that is evil.

Priest Therefore I ask these questions:

Do you turn to Christ?

All I turn to Christ.

Do you repent of your sins?

All I repent of my sins.

Do you renounce evil?

All I renounce evil

And now I ask you to make the profession of the Christian faith into which you were baptised, and in which you live and grow.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father who made the world?

All I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ who redeemed mankind?

All I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit who gives life the people of God?

All I believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

All This is our faith.

We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Priest Almighty God, we thank you for our fellowship in the household of faith with all those who have been baptised in your name. Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, almighty and eternal Father, and on this night of our redemption to celebrate with joyful hearts the memory of your wonderful works. For by the mystery of his passion Jesus Christ, your risen Son, has conquered the powers of death and hell and restored in men and women the image of your glory. He has placed them once more in paradise and opened to them the gate of life eternal. And so, in the joy of this Passover, earth and heaven resound with gladness, while angels and archangels and the powers of all creation sing for ever the hymn of your glory:

All Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are
full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Priest

Lord, you are holy indeed, the source of all holiness; grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit, and according to your holy will, these gifts of bread and wine may be to us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ;

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

And so, Father, calling to mind his death on the cross, his perfect sacrifice made once for the sins of the whole world; rejoicing in his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming in glory, we celebrate this memorial of our redemption.

As we offer you this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, we bring before you this bread and this cup and we thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. Send the Holy Spirit on your people and gather into one in your kingdom all who share this one bread and one cup, so that we, in the company of all the saints, may praise and glorify you for ever, through Jesus Christ our Lord;

By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.
